

MISSIONARY UPDATE

Rev. Andrew & Meredith Ronnevik Serving in Papua New Guinea



Dear family and friends,

Warm greetings from Papua New Guinea. As we look back on the season of Lent and celebrate the joy of Easter, we give thanks for the God who emptied himself to make us whole and who raised the One who was dead to life.

We sent our last newsletter in late December. Since then, we've traveled to Bribie Island in Australia for a holiday break, our friend Amanda came for a visit all the way from the U.S., Bea and Hans have started school, Meredith has become a seminary teacher, I've had our family's first cases of dengue fever and malaria, and our family marked one full year in PNG. Our new house on the seminary campus is feeling more like home, and the good soil in the yard around our house has produced abundantly.

The seminary started the 2025 school year in February. We started with heavy hearts, as a student returning home from vicarage (internship) died from a sudden illness. Amid grief, the semester began. Meredith is teaching English writing to seventeen first-year students in a 7:30 a.m. class focused on writing "key word" outlines, paraphrasing, and library skills. She'll continue with this group for the whole year.

I'm teaching "Advanced Reading and Writing" to upperlevel students in the bachelor's program, focusing largely on grammar so far, along with another round of "Contemporary Theology," this time with new readings. I'm also helping our New Testament professor prepare to launch a master's degree (MTh) program in theology in 2026—a big task, but one filled with promise.

During the recent school break, we joined other overseas Lutheran missionaries for our annual retreat, held this year in the mountain town of Bulolo. It was a welcome time away, with cooler temperatures and good fellowship. We returned in time to observe Holy Week here and to prepare for a new set of classes. Term 2, for both the seminary and the kids' school, start the week after Easter.

We remain deeply grateful for your support, prayers, and friendship. May the hope and joy of Easter continue to shape your days in this season of resurrection.
