A Prayer for a New Year

For now we see only a reflection, as in a mirror, but then we will see face to face.

(1 Cor. 13:12)

In 1944, in the liminal season of Christmas, Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote a poem meant to be a greeting to his family and his fiancé, Maria von Wedermeyer. He wrote it from a basement in a prison in Berlin. Amid bleak surroundings, his poem is at once a hymn and a prayer for a new year. We have the hymn in our red Evangelical Lutheran Worship (#626 *By Gracious Powers*). I invite you to find, read, pray, and sing it to yourself and maybe even sing it with others. It could also serve as another ray of light and newness for our congregation which reveals Christ's presence and goodness over the course of this new year. One of the things I love about this hymn is the way it gives voice to the realities we face in our lives and in our life together. That is: this hymn gives us language to borrow in our conversations with God when we can't seem to find the words on our own. What Bonhoeffer writes isn't flowery; it doesn't seek to numb you to the realities in which you find yourself. Instead, he looks directly at the things we face and writes to us from that context. This is one of the many gifts of music and poetry.

Think about your favorite song. How does it speak to you? What language in your favorite song helps you along the way? How does it help you? Where did you first become familiar with the song? What message does it give you?

In the final stanza of the hymn, Bonhoeffer writes:

*By gracious pow'r so faithfully protected,
so quietly, so wonderfully near,
we live each day in hope, with you beside us,
and go with you through ev'ry coming year. (ELW 626, v. 4)*

Even when things look bleak, Jesus Christ meets us where we are at and attends to us. We can't always make sense of where and how God is with us. Yet, in the season of Epiphany, we rest in the melody of grace that plays in our lives, even when snow and cold surrounds us, and our hearts grow weary and lonely. Even in these spaces, the promise of God holds us close in the glow of love's gracious presence.




2026 Spending Plan Review

Nancy Pickering



Nancy taught college theater costuming history, design, construction, and makeup at the University of North Texas and the University of West Florida.

Her creative work includes designing and sewing her own wedding dress based on an 1890s ball gown and spending three summers touring backstage with Sesame Street Live. She later shifted careers, earning a programming certificate and working as a technical writer for software documentation. Nancy currently serves as newsletter editor and designer for a Norwegian Heritage organization and the Norwegian Lutheran Memorial Church in Minneapolis. She and her husband, John Millar, have lived in Watertown since 1993 and have two dogs and two cats.

Nancy joined Trinity in 2018 and quickly felt at home. She has been active in the choir, Church Council, and as Volunteer Coordinator, lector, and communion assistant. She values Trinity's sense of community and finds worship both comforting and renewing.
