He was raising questions about the current practices of the church, many of which were backward, out of date, and even harmful. Martin Luther wanted to remind the church that God is always doing a new thing, reshaping, refining, and REFORMING God's precious people.

In the Bible we read these words about how God is constantly forming our hearts, transforming our minds, and conforming our lives according to God's will:

> "O Lord, we are the clay, and you are the potter. We are all the work of your hand." $\sim$ Isaiah $64: 8$

Maybe we need to add a new line to the end of that little song: Take my heart and form it, take my mind, transform it, take my will, conform it, and take my life, REFORM it by the power of your Spirit of Life. Amen!

## Special Congregational Meeting

Sunday, October 15 | 10:00 am

The Trinity Audio Visual (A/V) Team has been meeting since last spring to discuss the next steps in Trinity's move toward livestreaming our worship services. This discussion has actually been in the works for years, primarily for two reasons:

1. Our current sound system is 24 years old, installed in 1999, and is in need of major updates.
2. We have been recording our weekly worship services on a cell phone since the beginning of the pandemic in March 2020, and it is time to move ahead with a more permanent solution.

After considering various proposals, the A/V Team recommended that Trinity work with the Farber Lighting and Sound on this project at a cost of approximately $\$ 93,000$. This project will involve installing a new sound system, amplifiers, video cameras, software, training, and other items necessary to improve our sanctuary sound system and allow for the livestreaming of worship services.

The Church Council approved this recommendation at their September meeting. Additionally, the Finance Committee has offered their input and the Trinity Foundation has offered their support and plan to fund half of this initiative. Since a project of this size needs final approval by the entire congregation, please make every effort to attend this meeting and bring your comments and questions.

## What is the Gut Microbiome?

Our gastrointestinal tracts are made up of trillions of microorganisms (bacteria) which comprise our "gut microbiome". These microorganisms can be generally classified as healthy or unhealthy. We need a balance of healthy microorganisms to maintain adequate digestion and absorption of food, to prevent gut illnesses like inflammatory bowel disease, irritable bowel disease and colon cancer and to maintain an effective immune status. Emerging research is showing that we can alter our gut microbiome by what we eat.

Eating more plant foods can help you have a heathy variety of good bacteria in your gut. Try to include at least five different foods in each of these six categories per week.

- Whole grains: brown rice, oatmeal, quinoa, whole-wheat pasta, wild rice
- Nuts \& Seeds: almonds, peanuts, pistachios, sesame seeds, walnuts
- Veggies: carrots, green beans, spinach, squash, sweet potatoes
- Fruits: apples, blueberries, peaches, raspberries, tomatoes
- Legumes: black bean, chickpeas, edamame, lentils, peas
- Herbs \& Spices: basil, cinnamon, dill, ginger, rosemary

On World Communion Sunday, observed this year on October 1, Christians across the globe gather at the Lord's Table for the sacrament of Holy Communion. The Lord's Table stretches around the entire earth. Catholic Christians, Coptic Christians, Orthodox Christians, Reformed Christians, Evangelical Christians, Lutheran Christians, Baptist Christians, Anglican Christians, Methodist Christians, Christians who worship in churches bearing names that are unfamiliar to us - all join in worship and do what Christ asked his friends to do: remember him!
"This do in remembrance of me," Jesus said during the Last Supper with his disciples. Then he broke bread as a reminder of his sacrificed body and lifted the cup of wine representing his blood. The sacrament is a vivid symbol of Christ's sacrifice, love and forgiveness for each of us. As we gather as Christ's family around that table of grace, remember that we are united in Christ with our brothers and sisters around the world.
